	Vaccine Information
EWT	Eastern and Western Encephalomyelitis and Tetanus vaccines <u>Core Vaccine- Protects against diseases that are endemic to a specific region, pose a public health risk, or are highly virulent/contagious</u>
WNV	West Nile Virus vaccine <u>Core Vaccine- Protects against diseases that are endemic to a specific region, pose a public health risk, or are highly virulent/contagious</u>
Rabies	Rabies vaccine <u>Core Vaccine – Protects against rabies which is a fatal disease with significant public health implications. It is transmitted through the bite of an infected animal such as racoon, fox, skunk, or bat. It is required by law to be administered by a licensed veterinarian</u>
Flu/Rhino	Equine Influenza and Equine Rhinopneumonitis (<i>herpesvirus</i>) vaccine <u>Non core vaccine- Based on risk assessment and/or in consultation with your veterinarian. Use of the vaccine may differ between individuals, populations or geographic regions</u>
Strangles	Equine Strangles (<i>Streptococcus equi equi</i>). Not required in horses that have had Strangles symptoms in last 5 years <u>Non core vaccine- Based on risk assessment and/or in consultation with your veterinarian. Use of the vaccine may differ between individuals, populations or geographic regions</u>
Pneumabort	Equine Herpesvirus (<i>EHV 1 abortion virus</i>)
